



FROM YESTERDAY TO TODAY

Twenty-six members of the Abercorn Golden Age Club were present at its founding on May 17, 1972. At the outset, there was an equal number of English- and French-speaking members. This reflection of diversity is also evident in the meeting minutes, which were recorded in both English and French. The recommended annual membership fee was three dollars, making the club accessible while ensuring its proper operation. Initially composed of Abercorn residents, the club gradually welcomed members from Sutton.

In July 1972, the club officially and unanimously adopted the name **Club d'Âge d'Or d'Abercorn** after joining the Quebec Federation of Golden Age Clubs. In August of the same year, the Abercorn municipal council assigned the club a room located on the ground floor at 10 Des Églises Ouest Street in Abercorn, now known as the "golden age room." That designation is still used today. During this period, the club also received a federal grant of 4,000 under the "New Horizons" program, enabling the purchase of tables, chairs, and other equipment.

In 1996, the club adopted a new charter and took the name **Club d'âge d'or Les Deux Monts**, in tribute to the surrounding mountains, Sutton and Pinnacle, as well as the mixed origins of its members (Abercorn and Sutton). It later became the **Club FADOQ Les Deux Monts**, with its head office in Abercorn in accordance with municipal agreements regarding the premises and services.

As for the activities offered, the main ones include card games, organized outings, shared meals, and representation of the club at the regional level. The creation of the walking club, promoting physical well-being, also encourages social interaction and the discovery of new places. Over the years, the club has diversified its offerings through a variety of outings and strategic partnerships, such as the one established with Mont Sutton, allowing members to benefit from significant discounts on two ski days per week. At that time, the club had as many as 1,200 members.

From the very beginning, several traditions have endured, including card games, osteoporosis prevention exercises (EPO), snacks, and shared meals. The annual picnic is a special occasion during which membership cards are renewed in a warm and friendly atmosphere.

Today, FADOQ Richelieu-Yamaska (the regional club) is made up of seven sectors, and with its 700 members, the **Club FADOQ Les Deux Monts stands out as one of the most dynamic clubs in its sector**. The club offers a range of cultural, social, and sports activities, as well as lectures and workshops delivered by professionals such as notaries, pharmacists, and health specialists, covering various topics related to aging or specific expressed needs, particularly in the area of safety.

Communication and the sharing of information with members take several forms: in-person interactions during activities, by telephone, distribution of an annual calendar, a monthly newsletter, occasional emails (infoFADOQ), and management of a dedicated website (<https://club.fadoq.ca/M069>).

In addition, the club works closely and develops partnerships with the towns of Abercorn and Sutton, as well as with various community organizations, government bodies, and institutional partners.

Over the years, **volunteer administrators, supported by other volunteers** from the communities of Abercorn, Sutton, and elsewhere, have distinguished themselves through their commitment and involvement.

When Patricia Harvey, a long-time former administrator who remains active within the club, was asked the following question about the club's history: "What would be the club's greatest achievement?"

She answered: **"To still exist today."**
